A look at sixteen of the 2028 sophomore prospects from the IGBRR All-Indiana Showcase on August 3rd at Triton Central High School.



Kendra Ash 2028 / 6'1/ PF / Mt. Vernon / West Virginia Thunder

Kendra is an intriguing forward prospect in the 28' class with her combination of size, agility and ability to stretch out to the three-point line. She moves well in tight spaces, fluidly runs the floor and is comfortable with the ball away from the basket. As she continues to add strength to her length and mobility, she has the frontline tools to develop into a real matchup problem at the forward spot. She has transferred to Mt Vernon and should provide immediate help and production in the post for the Marauders.



Marianne Bleke 2028 / 5'11 / PF / Bellmont / OPS

Several coaches mentioned Marianne's play around the bucket at AIS. She has a long strong forward frame, played with good energy on the frontline, and was physical on both ends of the floor. She shows good hands and feet at the basket, can put together an attack out of the mid-post and showed nice touch on her finsihes. She went to the boards hard, kept good balance against contact and was a physical and mobile defender. She got varsity experience as a frosh and is frontliner to keep an eye on as she continues to develop.



Maia Blower 2028 / 5'5 / PG / Noblesville / IGB

Maia got starting minutes at the 4A varsity level for the Millers which says a lot about her game to play against that schedule and conference early in your high school career. She wasn't asked to score the ball for Noblesville but she certainly showed she is capable of that at AIS which included a 25-point performance. She has a strong guard frame, high instincts for the game for a youngster, handles as a primary and plays with nice motor. She was aggressive and skilled throughout the event, showing as an athletic playmaker. She was named to the All-Showcase team by the coaches and evaluators.



Ella Burleson 2028 / 5'8 / CG / Fishers / IBC

Ella is a bulldog that has a lot of skill from the backcourt. She plays with nice energy, is physical from the guard spot on both ends and is constantly in the mix making plays. She shows the ability to score the ball in a variety of ways, will go run down a rebound or loose ball, and is a solid on ball defender. She got minutes at the varsity level for the Tigers as a frosh and would expect her role to dramatically increase this coming season.



Brooklyn Crim 2028 / 5'9 / SF / New Palestine / West Virginia Thunder

Brooklyn got valuable 4A varsity experience last year as a frosh and I would expect her role to continue to grow for the Dragons. She has a strong forward frame, is a nice athlete with versatility in her game. Solid jump shooter out to the three-point line, physical downhill attacks and can mix it up around the bucket with her size and strength. She can go get a rebound against frontliners and can defend a few different spots with her size and mobility.



Quinnly Fife 2028 / 5'11 / SF / Bloomington South / IBC

The more we see Quinnly the more we like her upside with her length, agility, and versatility. She is fluid with the ball on the attack, can make plays going to the basket and can hit the open jumper. Her length and wingspan make her disruptive on the defensive end and she can go grab boards against frontliners. As she continues to add strength her game could really progress quickly. She is a youngster to keep an eye on over the next few years.



Nicole Glassley 2028 / 5'8 / SG / Mt Vernon / Indiana's Best

Nicole can put the ball in the bucket in bunches. Known for her ability to shoot it from deep but she is skilled and athletic on the attack to the basket as well. She has a good feel for the game, is a confident shooter and shows the ability to score it in a variety of ways, which included a 17-point game at AIS. She has transferred to Mt Vernon where she should have an immediate back with her offensive skillset.



Gabbi Harvey 2028 / 5'11/ SF / Brownsburg / Lady Gym Rats

We have seen Gabbi a couple times over the club season, and she has a nice combination of size, skill and athleticism. Before turning an ankle early in game two, she was among the most impressive prospects at the event with her ability to consistently get buckets at all levels in a variety of ways. She is long, strong and a solid athlete that is a tough matchup for most. She can knock down the three, put together physical athletic attacks from the wing and can operate around the basket with her size and agility. She has a lot D1 type of tools as she keeps developing.



Katharine Lehr 2028 / 5' 7 / PG / Bloomington North / IBC

We have seen Kathrine a lot across all formats of play and she is consistently one of the top lead guards in the class. She plays with nice athleticism, has high level instincts and is balanced between facilitating and getting buckets. She handles as a primary with poise, shows good agility on the attack and is an athletic playmaker on both ends. She had a breakout frosh season and would expect her output to continue to accelerate. She had a 27-point outburst at AIS and was named by the coaches and evaluators to the All-Showcase team.



Madelynn Matelic 2028 / 6'0 / SF /Speedway / Indiana Showcase

Madelynn's game continues to develop and improve nearly each time we see her. She is long, mobile, and her fluidity on the attack is improving as is her overall offensive skillset. She led the Sparkplugs in scoring and rebounding as a frosh and would expect her output to continue to increase. Her length, agility and emerging skillset give her a lot of versatility on both ends and nice upside. She had a nice showing at AIS, including a 17-point game.



Bella Ramsey 2028 / 5'8 / CG / CG / Carmel / West Virginia Thunder

Bella is part of a very talented 28' backcourt class at Carmel and got valuable varsity experience as frosh against one of the toughest 4A schedules in the state. She is a solid athlete, shows the ability to score it in a variety of ways and can handle the ball as needed. I thought she looked much more aggressive and confident about looking for her shots in July and saw that at AIS as well where she had a couple of productive games and was named to the All-Showcase team by the coaches and evaluators.



Luci Reich 2028 / 5'8 / CG / Huntington North / Always 100

We really like Luci's game and she is was playing in her second AIS already. She had a productive freshman season and thought she was standout in July in games we caught. She has some length, is athletic on the attack and shows the ability to score it at all levels. She can handle the ball as needed, has a good feel for the game and is consistently in the mix as a playmaker on both ends. Expect she could have a huge sophomore season for the Vikings.



Aubrey Sparks 2028 / 5'8 / CG / Owen Valley / Indiana Pride

Aubrey had a monster freshman season as one the leading scorers in the state at 20+ PPG. She has a nice natural feel for the game, can create shots on her own and has a balance between her jump shots and attacks. She is a solid athlete, is aggressive and puts a lot of pressure on her matchup on both ends. She had a consistent productive day throughout, including a 17-point game, and was named by the coaches and evaluators to the All-Showcase team.



Natalie Stenger 2028 / 5'7 / CG / East Central / Indiana Pride

Natalie led the 4A Trojans in scoring as a frosh. She is a dynamic athletic guard that is consistently in the mix and making plays with her big motor skilled play on both ends. She is agile on the attack, gets herself to the free throw line, and is capable jump shooter out to the three-point line. She creates a lot of chaos and turnovers on the defensive end that lead to transition points. She had games of 19 and 18 points on her way to being named to the All-Showcase teams by the coaches and evaluators.



MaKenna Taylor 2028 / 5'7 / CG / Jeffersonville / Sports City Angels

MaKenna is a talented backcourt prospect in the 28' class that has a dynamic offensive skillset paired with high level instincts for the game. She can handle as a primary, has nice court vision on the move and can score the ball at all levels in a variety of ways. She excels as a three-point shooter with range while also having the athleticism and skillset to create on the attack to the bucket. A productive and creative playmaker on both ends. She had an outstanding day at AIS, including a 28-point game, and was named to the All-Showcase team by the coaches and evaluators.



Nora Thomann 2028 / 5'8 / SF / North Vermillion / Legacy Force Supreme

Nora led the Falcons as a frosh in both scoring and rebounding, averaging a double-double. We saw her for the first time in July and noted her aggressive athletic play. She is probably a bit undersized to make a living at the basket against high level competition, but she can put together athletic attacks out of the mid-post, has a solid mid-range game and gets to the free throw line at a high rate. As she keeps developing from the wing, and as a jump shooter she has a good deal of upside. She had a nice showing throughout the day and showed she belonged among the high-level competition.



Madison Wallace 2028 / 5'6 / PG / Carmel / West Virginia Thunder

Madison is a natural leader that brings the energy level up in the gym, which is a great quality for a lead guard. She is vocal, has high level instincts and plays with a maturity beyond her years. She has solid backcourt skillet, a balanced game between setting up teammates and finding her scoring chances and makes good decisions with the ball on the attack. She broke into the starting rotation at 4A Carmel as a frosh which says a lot about her game. She had a really nice showing t AIS, including 18-point game.
